GRAND OPENING!!

On November 11, 2021, more than 180 people came out to celebrate the Grand Opening of the History Center in Memory of Pete Richards at the Fort Fremont Preserve. FFF worked with Beaufort County (BC) for many years in the planning of the building. Construction was overseen by the County.

FFF worked hand-in-hand with BC in the planning of the event. BC Passive Parks Manager, Ms. Stefanie Nagid presided over the event that included: a Presentation of the Colors by the Whale Branch Early College High School Marine Corps JROTC color guard, a Gullah/Geechee honoring ritual by Queen Quet; welcoming addresses by BC Administrator Eric Greenway, BC Councilman Paul Sommerville, and FFF President Kathy Mixon. FFF Marian Rollings gave the memorial address for Pete Richards and presented his wife, Betsy, with a commemorative plaque. The atmosphere of the ceremony was enhanced by patriotic music provided by members of the Parris Island Marine Band.

National Military History Organizations Visit Fort Fremont

The Coast Defense Study Group (CDSG), a national organization devoted to the study of the nation's coastal defense fortifications and the Council on America's Military Past (CAMP), a national organization devoted to all aspects of our military history held their annual conferences in the area. Approximately 60 members of both groups visited Fort Fremont on the morning of October 15.

The tour was organized by Ted Panayotoff, AKA Sgt. Ted. Volunteers spent countless hours cutting back vines and other vegetation and cleaning up the grounds to get ready for the tour. The Beaufort County Passive Parks Manager, Stefanie Nagid opened the History Center before the official grand opening to accommodate the group.

Visitors were shown the exhibits in the new History Center including the diorama of the fort as it existed around 1910 by FFF member and diorama creator Dennis Cannady. The two concrete gun batteries were described by FFF member docents, some in period uniforms. Visitors made use of a new smartphone downloadable guided tour with narration and historic photos. Refreshments (traditional coffee and donuts) were served in the new picnic pavilion by an appropriately dressed "donut dolly".

The groups appreciated all the effort made on their behalf. The CDSG newsletter stated, "A new visitors' center has just been completed and opened especially for the CDSG visit. This was a pleasant surprise. The nice grounds, cleaned up batteries, and great phone app interpretive tour was a welcome change from the neglected batteries of 20 years ago."

Kudos to everyone who made this tour a success. It was great national exposure for Fort Fremont!

Pete Richards 1942-2020. Pete, founder and first president of the Friends of Fort Fremont, was the driving force for rediscovering Ft. Fremont's legacy in its appropriate local, national, and international historical context. His energy, enthusiasm, and dogged determination transformed an unknown historical ruin into a recognized historical relic of interest to many. In 2021, *Beaufort County recognized Pete's contributions by naming the Fort Fremont History Center in Memory of Pete Richards*.

Carl Dorr 1924-2021. Carl was an engineer, Army aviator, race car driver, and a man of many passions. He had a life-long love of military history and was an ardent supporter of Fort Fremont for over 50 years. A memorial fund has been established in Carl's name. The



funds will be used to preserve the Fort.
